DAY CELEBRATE – WORLD POPULATION DAY




World Population Day is a great event being celebrated all through the world annually on 11th of July. It is celebrated to increase the awareness of the people towards the worldwide population issues.



However, the intrusion by Pakistani forces led to war. When the intrusions were detected by the Indian army, they launched an operation called 'Operation Vijay.' The Indian army overcame insurmountable odds and successfully forced back the Pakistani troops back and recaptured all previously lost posts. Since then the day is celebrated as Kargil Vijay Diwas.

However, India lost more than 500 military men during the war. Several Indian soldiers were facilitated for their bravery and sacrifice including Captain Vikram Batra, Grenadier Yogendra Singh and more.

Krishna Janmashtami marks the birthday of Lord Krishna. He was the eighth son of the princess Devaki and King Vasudeva. It is celebrated by Hindus in the month of August or September all across India but the festival is vital in Mathura and Vrindavan where he spent his childhood days.

It is believed that Lord Krishna was born on 18th July 3228 BCE and lived until 18th February 3102 BCE. His birthplace was Mathura which is located in the present-day Mathura district of Uttar Pradesh. He belonged to the Vrishni clan of Yadavas from Mathura. King Kansa, the brother of Devaki, then ruled Mathura. He captured the throne by imprisoning his father, King Ugrasena. Kansa was a cruel ruler. He tortured the people of Mathura. Everybody wanted to get freed from the evil rule of Kansa.

On the occasion the temples and homes are wonderfully decorated and lightened. Religious hymns are sung at temples. The priests bath the idol with Panchamrita which comprises of water from the holy Ganges River, milk, ghee or clarified butter, curd, and honey pouring all these from a conch shell. Then the idol of infant Krishna is placed in a cradle. Raslilas are performed to remember the childhood memories of Lord Krishna.

DAY CELEBRATE -- ARTICLE 370



Special plans are in place for the BJP to celebrate August 5 as a historic day in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir. On this day last year, the Bill to abrogate Article 370 and abolish Section 35A of the Constitution was passed by the Rajya Sabha under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah.

Under party president JP Nadda, the BJP has devised a 'One India Campaign' or 'Ek Bharat, Ek Atma Bharat'. Nadda has personally taken an interest in ensuring that the message reaches out to every booth and to the mandal level.

The central BJP has special plans for the same in a nationwide campaign. However, all eyes will be on the J&K state unit to make this a success. The state unit has decided on a 15-day campaign to tell people how August 5 should be celebrated each year "as the brightest date of their lives". Plans include holding virtual meetings, publishing handouts and distributing them, with the idea being to tell people that all strata of society, including Gorkhas, Dalits among others, will get their rights after several decades.

On August 5 in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, the national flag will be hoisted at every panchayat and the national anthem will be sung between 9am and 11am. Earthen lamps will be lit in the evening in every house.

DAY CELEBRATE – National Sports Day



This prompted his teammates to give him the name "Chand", a name which means the moon. That is how he became known as Dhyan Chand.

The sole reason behind celebrating National Sports Day lies in championing the spirit of sportsmanship and propagating the message of various sports. The states of Punjab and Haryana are particularly involved in this and the celebrations are done with a lot of pomp and flair. DAY CELEBRATE— Onam Festival





Among the many peaceful civil rights movements he initiated was the Dandi March where he protested against the salt tax imposed by the British in the year 1930. He also protested during the Quit India movement in 1942 calling for the British to leave India. He assumed leadership of the Indian National Congress in 1921 and led nationwide campaigns for various social causes and for achieving Swaraj or self-rule.

The most well-known contributions of Mahatma Gandhi in India's non-violent civil rights movement to attain freedom were the Champaran and Khdea Satyagrah. Non-cooperation movement, Salt Satyagrah and Quit India movement.

Fondly called father of the nation, Gandhi's birthday is known in India as Gandhi Jayanti. It is a national holiday in the country and is celebrated as the International Day of Nonviolence across the world. This day is marked by prayer services and tributes all over India, including at Gandhi's memorial Raj Ghat in New Delhi where he was cremated. Colleges, government and political institutions celebrate it through prayer meetings and commemorative ceremonies.

'New Age Teacher: Challenges and opportunities' online lecture.


The school of Education, Galgotias University was orgainsed a online principle talk on 3 oct 2020.




Webinar -- Lecture "Entrepreneurship &\ IPR"

productivity.










Resources: such as men, money, materials are limited in supply and serve as input into the educational system. These inputs include--:


- 1. Men (M): teachers, policy makers, non-teaching staff;

- 5. Time.




- ✓ Education is one of the most important factors that lead a country to sustained economic growth.




