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UNCRPD- United Nation Convention on the Rights of Person with Disabilities.

It aims to ensure that disabled people enjoy the same human rights as everyone else and that they can participate fully in society by receiving the same opportunities as others.

To bring disabled person into mainstream by providing them proper facilities and help

Special stress on children and women as they are most vulnerable.

Special focus on education and create awareness for educational facilities of disabled.

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The purpose of UNCRPD is to promote, protect and ensure the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by all persons with disabilities and to promote respect for their inherent dignity.

It was adopted on 13
December 2006 at the
United Nations
Headquarters in New
York.

It was opened for signature on 30 March 2007.

There were 82 signatories to the Convention, 44 signatories to the Optional Protocol.

The Convention was the first human rights treaty of the twenty-first century.

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There are eight guiding principles that underlie the Convention:

- Respect for inherent dignity, individual autonomy including the freedom to make one's own choices, and independence of persons
- Non-discrimination
- Full and effective participation and inclusion in society
- Respect for difference and acceptance of persons with disabilities as part of human diversity and humanity
- Equality of opportunity
- Accessibility
- Equality between men and women
- Respect for the evolving capacities of children with disabilities and respect for the right of children with disabilities to preserve their identities

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It is an international treaty that aims to protect the rights and dignity of persons with disabilities.

The Convention became one of the most quickly supported human rights instruments in history, with strong support from all regional groups. The purpose of UNCRPD is to promote, protect and ensure the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by all persons with disabilities and to promote respect for their inherent dignity.

UNCRPD takes appropriate action to protect all the rights of person with disabilities
