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
What are organizations?

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The complex forces that act on organizations:


- People

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Evolution of Organizational Behaviour

Robert Owen-(1800)

- Young Factory Owner-First to emphasize the human needs of employees and refused to employ children
- Taught workers to improve working conditions
- Father of personnel management

Andrew Ure-(1935)

- The Philosophy of Manufacturers -1835
- Value of human factor in manufacturing
- Provided welfare facilities to workers

J.N. TATA in 1886 Instituted a pension fund & 1895 began to pay accident compensation.
