Nursing Rounds And Reports

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Definition:

"A Nursing Round is a tour into the pateint's ward to provide the students a learning experience.In this clinical teaching method, a group of nurses visit all or selected pateint at their bedside in a particular wards with directly or indirectly contributing into clinical teaching"

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- 1. To illustrate skillful Nursing care.
- To learn about disease, pattern of care and treatment.
- 3. To compare clients reaction to disease.
- 4. To demonstrate the effects of drugs.
- 5. Instructional purpose for students nurses.
- 7. To demonstrate symptoms important in Nursing.
- 7. To acquaint nurses with all pateints on the more purposeful care may be achieved for each pateints.

Purpose

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Factors

- 1. Always introduce yourself to the pateint to avoid miscommunication.
- 2. Always explain procedure to the pateint.
- 3. Always listen to the pateint as a active listener to make pateint feel important.
- 4. Always keep in mind the probable value and availablity of the clinical material.
- 5. Records Nursing Rounds in ward teaching rounds.
- 6. To consult students previous clinical experience to avoid repetition and to add to earlier experience.

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- INFORMATION GIVING ROUNDS: it is used to provide adequate information to the staff with the patients onwards or division.
- 2. INSTRUTION ROUNDS: here nurses come and read the records of the pateints and if procedure is required they should be carried out.
- 3. PROBLEM SOLVING ROUNDS: here nurses are problems focused assess pateints needs and conditions indentify care problem for the pateints.

Types of Nursing Rounds.

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1. A breif Information – records of the pateint should be

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- held at the side table to the pateint.
- 2. The purpose of visit to the pateint is done by nurses and doctors- for special observation.
- 3. Nurses herself may present users or she may ask students to answer the questions of the group's or her questions.
- 4. The participants may also be involved such as counting pulse, respiration, examining the conjuctive ,etc.
- The pateint case sheet can also be utilized with presentation.
- 6. Thank the pateint before leaving and tidy up the bed.

Methods of conducting nursing Rounds:

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Advantage:

- 1. This method provides opportunity to learn about the patients progress through the highly experienced nuring expert.
- 2. Nursing Rounds provides an opportunity for students to learn about the effect of different drugs, treatment modalities and nuring intervention and change in the plan of medical and nursing management based on the progress of patients.
- 3. This method facilitates to learn about more patients in short time through Nursing Rounds.

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Disadvantage

- It is not a suitable method of teaching for a bigger group of students.
- The bedside discussion about patients during nuring Round may be discomforting And uncomfortable for patients and it may be a cause of anxiety.
- It may be wastage of time for nurses who are not directly involved in care of particular pateint.

Report

"reports are oral or written, exchange of information shared between care giver (healthcare provider) and the patient in many ways..

Nurses communicate information about clients so that all health care team members can make appropriate decision making about clients care."

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Purpose of Report writing.

- * Reports is an essential tool for communication.
- * To show the kind and amount of services rendered over a specific period.
- * To illustrate progress in teaching goals.
- * As an aid in studying health condition.
- * As an aid in planning.

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* To interpret the services to public and to other interested agencies.

Commonly used reporting:

CHANGE OF SHIFT REPORT:* this is the most common used reporting in nursing.

- At the end of each shift nurses maintain proper records for the pateints condition, which is helpful for next nurse to understand present situation of the patient. This helps in continuing care of the pateint for their better condition.
- : * Establish essential back ground data on pateint.
- * Describe objective about pateints condition as response of health problems.
- Evaluate for result of nursing / medical care provided to pateint.
- Be clear on priorities for betterment of pateint.

TRANSFER REPORT: When pateints are transfer from one unit to another to receive different level of care and treatment.

INFORMATION PROVIDED IN TRANSFER REPORT

- : pateint Name, age, sex, problem and medical diagnosis.
- * Describe about breif summary Of program till time of transfer.

describe about pateints heath status.

- Allergies drugs and medication.
- Current treatment status.

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Transfer Report.

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- INCIDENCE /OCCURRENCE REPORT: incedence means event that is not consistent with the routine operation of health care unit.
- Incedents are commonly occur when pateint under care within hospital settings.
- Incident people are in major part of a unit quality improvement program.
- **TYPES OF INCEDENCE**: falling from bed or in toilet.
- * neddle stick injuries
- Burns
- Drugs or medication administration errors
- Accidental omission of ordered therapies

Incidence Report.

Telephone Report.

- TELEPHONE REPORT'S: nurses inform physician or other health care team members regarding changes in pateint condition during caring and communicate information to nurses on other units about client's transfer.
- Telephone report's also can be utilizes a laboratory staff or other radiological staff to providing immediate results about pateint.
