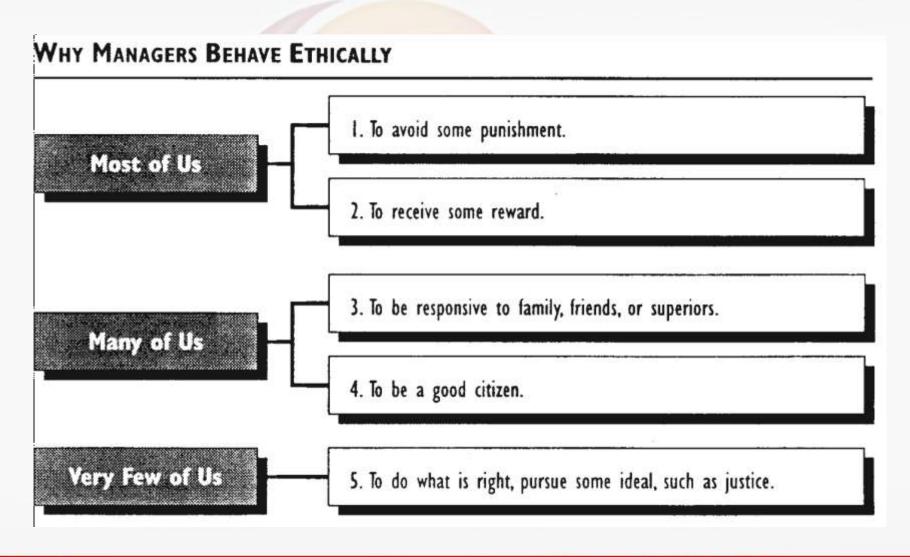

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## Communication

False and misleading advertising and deceptive personal-selling tactics anger customers and may cause a business to fail



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## Business relationships

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 Business people must be ethical toward their customers, suppliers, and others in their workplace

## Reasons for Not Reporting

#### Observed Misconduct

- 1.Didn't believe corrective action
- 2. Feared retribution from supervisor
- 3. Feared they wouldn't remain anonymous
- 4. Thought someone else would report the misconduct
- 5.Didn't know who to contact

## Six Steps to Improve Business Ethics

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- 1.Top management support
- 2. Expectations begin at the top
- 3. Ethics imbedded in training
- 4. Ethics office set up
- 5.External stakeholders informed
- 6. There must be enforcement
