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INTRODUCTION

The main purpose of ROL is to convey to the readers about the work already done and the knowledge and ideas are already established.

It contributes for new knowledge and insight pertaining to the topic.

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Definitions

A literature review is a body of text that aims to review the critical points of knowledge on a particular topic of research.

(ANA, 2000)

A literature review is an account of what has been already established or published on a particular research topic by accredited scholars and researchers.

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(University of Toronto, 2001)

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SOURCES OF ROL

- Two main sources:
- 1. Primary sources
- 2. Secondary sources

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Primary sources

- Primary sources are original, peer reviewed and published journal articles reported by original researchers.
- A primary source is written by person who developed the theory or conducted the research.
- Example: An original qualitative study on patient's experiences in ICU: Shilpa,K. (2020)

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Secondary sources

Secondary source research documents are description of studies prepared by someone other than the original researcher.

It includes the comments and summaries of multiple research studies on one topic, eg: systemic reviews, meta-analysis etc.
