 This heavy duty flooring is used for basement corridors, storerooms, stairways and laundry

Stone (marble, granite, limestone)

- The natural stone are available in slab form, is usually cut in tiles from quarried blocks of the stone or rocks
- Floors made from marble & granite are expensive and hard on feet
- Provides beautiful flooring material that has a timeless, elegant quality
- They referred as hard floors because they offer no resilience, are cold underfoot and noisy in comparison to other types of floors

slate

- This is used in store rooms, kitchens, back areas and laundry
- It is hard surface

Ceramic tiles

- Ceramics tiles are natural product made from clay,
- Glazed ceramics tiles have a ceramic coating applied to the tile body, which gives the tile its colour and finish

Glazed tiles are used in kitchens and bathrooms


- This tiles is best known for its imperviousness to water and other soils.

- Used in laundry, cold storage and back areas
- Instead of shiny surface they are use in kitchens, canteens, bathroom, corridor and laundries.
