

Teacher Education: Perspectives, Research and Issues (MEDU2008)

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Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (The Education for all), is an Indian Govt program aimed at the universalization of elementary education "in a time bound manner", as mandated by the 86th amendment to the Constitution of India making free and compulsory education to children of ages 6–14 a fundamental right. The programme was pioneered by Atal Bihari Vajpayee.


To achieve the goal of Universalization of Elementary Education (UEE) in a time bound manner

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SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

- A programme with a clear time frame for universal elementary education
- A response to the demand for quality basic education all over the country
- An opportunity for promoting social justice through basic education.
- A partnership between the Central, State and the local government
- An opportunity for States to develop their own vision of elementary education

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SARVA SHIKSHA ABHIYAN

- An expression of political will for universal elementary education across the country
 - An effort at effectively involving the Panchayati Raj Institutions, School Management Committees, Village and Urban Slum level Education Committees, Parents' Teachers' Associations, Mother Teacher Associations, Tribal Autonomous Councils and other grass root level structures in the management of elementary schools.

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- ❖ To provide useful and elementary education for all children in the 6-14 age group.
- ❖ To bridge social, regional and gender gaps with the active participation of community in the management of schools.
- To allow children to learn about and master their natural environment in order to develop their potential both spiritually and materially.
- To inculcate value-based learning
- To realize the importance of Early Childhood Care and education and looks at the 0-14 age as a continuum.

(SSA) has
two aspects

It provides a wide convergent framework for implementation of Elementary Education schemes

The programme seeks to open new schools in those habitations which do not have schooling facilities and strengthen existing school infrastructure through provision of additional class rooms, toilets, drinking water, maintenance grant and school improvement grants

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Holistic view of Education:

curriculum, teacher education, educational planning and management as interpreted in the National Curriculum Framework 2005

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BROAD STRATEGIES CENTRAL TO SSA PROGRAMME

Equity:

To mean not only equal opportunity, but also creation of conditions in which the disadvantaged sections of the society — children of SC, ST, Muslim minority, landless agricultural workers and children with special — needs, etc. — can avail of the opportunity

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BROAD STRATEGIES CENTRAL TO SSA PROGRAMME

Access:

Not to be confined to ensuring that a school becomes accessible to all children within specified distance but implies an understanding of the educational needs and predicament of the traditionally excluded categories – the SC, ST and others sections of the most disadvantaged groups, the Muslim minority, girls in general, and children with special needs.

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BROAD STRATEGIES CENTRAL TO SSA PROGRAMME

Gender concern:

Not only enabling girls to keep pace with boys but also to bring about a basic change in the status of women.

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Centrality of Teacher:

To motivate them to innovate and create a culture in the classroom, and beyond the classroom, that might produce an inclusive environment for children, especially for girls from oppressed and marginalized backgrounds

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- One teacher for every 40 children in Primary and upperprimary
- At least two teachers in a Primary school

SCHOOL

 Within one Kilometer of every habitation

CLASS-ROOM

- A room for every teacher in Primary & Upper Primary
- A room for Head-Master in upper Primary School



- Only through school management committees
- Up to 5K per year as per specific proposal by the school committee

SCHOOLS'
GRANT

- 2K per year per primary/upper school for replacement of non functional school equipment
- Transparency about utilisation

PROVISIONS FOR CWSN

 Up to Rs.1200/- per child for integration of disabled children, as per specific proposal



 Upto Rs.1500/- per school per year

MANAGE MENT Not to exceed 6% of the budget of a district plan



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

The project will be implemented by the education department and will be the city's first mobile school bus service. Initially two buses will be pressed into service. The yellow buses will be fitted with a television screen and equipped with computers, multimedia facilities, a book library, blackboard and toys. Each bus will also have two teachers special-

ly trained to educate children through books, computers, exhibits, films, workshops, etc. "The buses will go to red light areas, construction sites and slum clusters where children do not have access to education. The buses will go to three-four such points in different parts of the city everyday park there for two hours and provide education to the children inside the bus," said Rina Ray Dalls education secretary.
