#### **Proposed System**

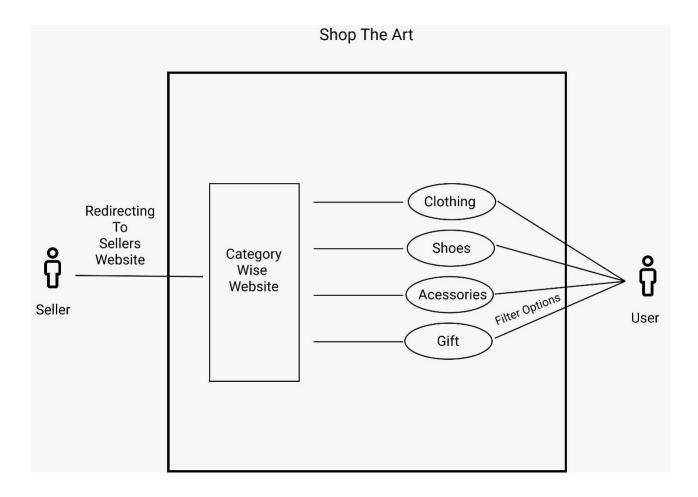
Seller Side –

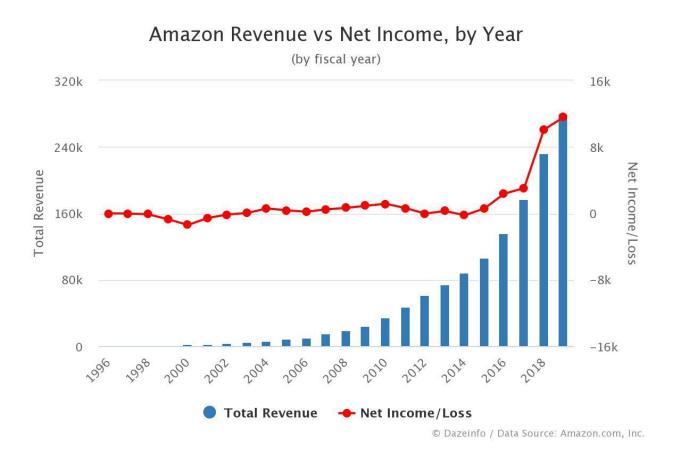
#### How Small Business Are Effected
